

Clinical Faculty Position in International Business focusing on Chinese Business Studies

GEORGIA STATE UNIVERSITY invites applications for a rank open, non-tenure track, clinical faculty position specializing in Chinese business studies effective summer or fall semester 2012. This position requires an earned doctorate from an AACSB-accredited institution or similarly accredited international institution. Successful applicants will have strong teaching, research, and outreach capabilities in Chinese business, including extensive relationships with the academic community in China, and good communication ability in Mandarin Chinese. Candidates should have a strong teaching record in Chinese business and related international areas at an AACSB-accredited institution, a current publication record in refereed journals, a demonstrated ability to develop significant business community outreach, and experience leading student groups to China. The clinical position will enhance the University's Second Century Initiative focusing on Chinese studies, further strengthening the interdisciplinary focus on Chinese studies at Georgia State University. The position will also enrich the teaching and outreach capability of the Institute of International Business (IIB) which was recently designated as a national resource center in international business (CIBER) by the U.S. Department of Education.

Georgia State University has been recognized as one of the most diverse campuses in the nation with a student body representing more than 120 countries. The Robinson College of Business is located in the heart of a vibrant, dynamic international community which includes a growing number of US and foreign firms' headquarters, a strong consular corps and many other government agencies.
