The Robinson College of Business seeks applications and nominations for one or more non-tenure track positions in the area of Organizational Behavior/Human Resource Management. The successful candidate will begin employment in August, 2012. The position includes teaching at the graduate and/or undergraduate levels in the College's academic programs. The position is rank open but we expect to hire at the Clinical Assistant Professor level. Clinical faculty hold academic titles (i.e. Clinical Assistant Professor, Clinical Associate Professor, Clinical Professor) and have opportunities for promotion based upon demonstrated excellence in teaching and being active in scholarship that includes the scholarship of teaching and may include practitioner and/or disciplinary research.

Candidates for this position must have an earned doctorate in a relevant field from an AACSB accredited university and a demonstrated ability for teaching excellence within Organizational Behavior/Human Resource Management, with the capability for publishing research in refereed journals (pedagogical, practitioner or disciplinary). Salary and other types of support are competitive with other research universities. The positions are contingent upon final budget approval by the University.
